

Antioch Discipleship School FAQs

1. What is the vision for the Antioch Discipleship School?

The Discipleship School exists to make disciples of Jesus who transform towns and nations. Students do this by developing practical life skills, pursuing personal wholeness, growing in healthy relationships, understanding the character of God, carrying a Biblical worldview and having a Great Commission mindset.

2. What are the important dates for ADS '18-'19?

August 24th-26th, 2018 — Fall Retreat
August 27th, 2018 — First class
May 6th, 2019 — Last class
May 6th, 2019 — Graduation
May/June 2019 — 2-week international outreach trip

3. What is the application deadline?

March 26th, 2019

4. How much is tuition and are payment plans available?

Tuition for 2018-2019 is \$1,500/student. Payment plans are not available for most situations.

5. What does the tuition go towards? What does it not include?

Tuition pays for class materials, staff, speakers, World Mandate, Fall retreat, stateside outreach, & other activities. It does not include the cost of the outreach trip at the end of the year.

6. How much class time/days/hours happens weekly?

Every Monday & the 1st/3rd Thursdays of every month from 6-9:30pm (6 classes/month total)

7. What happens during class every week?

No two classes are the same. Some elements of the school include worship, teachings from various speakers, practicing what is learned in class, discipleship groups and Bible study.

8. What happens when ADS is over?

Our prayer is that you graduate ADS with unshakable faith in Jesus and the practical ability to walk with him wherever he takes you. You are also eligible after ADS to begin the process of moving overseas by applying for a Serve Year or the Church Planting School.

9. Can I work while in the school?

Yes! Every student is actually required to work at least 20 hours per week during ADS.

10. Can I be in school while doing ADS?

We generally discourage being a full-time undergraduate student while doing the school. Please feel free to bring your personal situation to the Directors for further conversation.
